Hosting Organization: IPYL-The International Palestinian Youth League and CCHR (Center for Cultural Heritage Reservation-Bethlehem).

Introduction:

The project seeks to bring young people from various cultures together to build bridges of understanding, reconciliation, and peace. The long term goal of project is to prepare youth to make positive contributions to their future and society through the values of understanding, helping, contributing tolerance, and respectful coexistence. These goals are achieved through education –awareness reaction, youth empowerment and work camps.

Project Description:

The volunteers will work in different areas in Bethlehem city. The work includes renovation of old sites near the church of the Nativity and assisting the Bethlehem municipality in preparing for the Christmas season; painting the streets, distribution of booklets and flyers to the tourists, decorating walls.. etc. (more detailed program will be sent to the volunteers ahead of the workcamp).

Food and Accommodation:

The volunteers will be hosted in flats near the Manger Square (walking distance from the Nativity Church) where men and women stay in separated rooms. The accommodation includes hot water and kitchen with basic equipment. The volunteers will cook by themselves through the kitchen group. Tea and coffee will be available all the time.

There might be curfew for the workcamp, which would be around mid night, unless we have some activities around the church or in the city that night.

Cultural Activities:

The afternoon will be used to give volunteers an inter-cultural learning experience, with a focus on showing the international volunteers Palestinian culture within the context of the occupation and hopes for the future. This will involve visits to refugee camps in Bethlehem, visiting the associations in the city, tours of place of interest, lectures, and most importantly interaction with the local people. The volunteers will be able to visit the different associations and centers where they can watch Documentaries about the situation in Palestine and the Middle East. They will also have the opportunity to speak with the Palestinian politicians and activists to open the space for them to find the answers for all the questions

they want to ask.

The volunteers will also have the opportunity to visit other cities in the west bank.

Why in Bethlehem?

Bethlehem is considered a central hub of Palestinian cultural and tourism industries. The city has significant values for Christians as it is considered the birthplace of Jesus of Nazareth according to the Gospels. Bethlehem is also home to one of the largest Palestinian Christian communities in the Middle East. In addition, Bethlehem has three Palestinian Refugee Camps (Dhisha, Al-Azza and Aida). The construction of the Israeli apartheid wall has had severe negative impact on Bethlehem; politically, socially, and economically. The wall runs along the northern side of the town's built-up area, within meters of houses in 'A'ida refugee camp on the one side, and the Jerusalem on the other.

The workcamp will be running in the period of Christmas, where Bethlehem is the best place to celebrate the Christmas. The volunteers will have the opportunity to celebrate the Christmas with the Palestinians and express their solidarity with them.

Location: Workcamp location is **Martyrs Memorial Park** situated on the top of a small hill near **Hetauda** City of Makwanpur district (about 120KM from Kathmandu). This is the first such a kind of public park in Nepal established by local initiative (by Hetauda Municipality). We are organizing International Workcamps there to help in construction and designing the park since 2000.

Work: FFN started to build a multi-purpose building project there since 2002. Now this building construction work is in final stage. We have taken it as a model workcamp project. It will be a house built by volunteers. We are also developing an attractive garden around the building. Besides it volunteer help in day to day work in the park i.e. gardening, cleaning of picnic spots, feeding to animals in mini zoo, selling entrance tickets etc.

Food and Accommodation: FFN arranges accommodation in private rented or community house. A shower will be available at the camp house, but not the standard you are used to in your country. Nepalese daily food is Dal Bhat, like Dal (soup of lentil or beans), Bhat (cooked rice), Tarkari (cooked vegetable), is provided. This is the staple diet of the Nepalese and it is eaten everyday. The camp leader will try to offer some different foods but if you would like to enjoy your native meals please bring food from your own country. Volunteers will help to prepare meals in turns.

Meeting Point: Friendship Foundation Nepal (FFN) office or Pilgrims Guest House. We are sorry to mention that we can't pick up all volunteers at the airport due to entrance difficulties at the arrival of Tribhuvan International airport in Kathmandu. If volunteer stay at least one day in **Pilgrims Guest House** they are agreed to pick up to our volunteers in nominal cost (Rs 500, Euro 5). Therefore volunteers are requested to send their arrival information to us in time so that we can ask **Pilgrims Guest House** to pick up you. Location: Bhorle village of Chitwan district, about 130 KM south west from Kathmandu in center of Nepal. Bhorle is a popular workcamp destination for international volunteers. We are working there since 1995 and hundreds of volunteers already joined international workcamp in Bhorle. Major attraction of Bhorle is their rich Gurung culture, friendly behavior of local people to volunteers and their active participation in cultural exchange day. More than that, Bhorle is located on the foot of two high mountains and closed to Trisuli river famous for rafting (you can see rafting boats from camp house !)

Chitwan is the main destination for the jungle adventures and wild life in the world. One horned rhino, Bengal tiger, gharials (long/short snout) crocodiles, species of birds and others, are the main attraction of Chitwan district.

Work: There are varieties of works in Bhorle workcamp. 1. Physical work to build more facilities in camp house i.e new rooms, painting, gardening etc. 2. Educational activities in local primary school i.e. teaching English, sport, music etc. 3. Environmental awareness activities with local women's group (how to keep their village beautiful by keeping clean, using toilet, not throwing plastic or paper everywhere, volunteers are welcome to present their new ideas !

Food and Accommodation: FFN has camp house in Bhorle. Food and accommodation will be arranged there. In 10-15mins walk from the house the volunteers can reach a small town where amenities such as banks, shops, post office and internet cafe are available

The work will depend upon the season but may include planting and harvesting different crops. Volunteers will also work to maintain the farm area by cleaning, weeding and watering. The work will also include caring for the animals (goats, cow and chicken). PROJECT: For over 14 years this project has been organized in the Turtle Camp at Colola Beach with extraordinary results. This project is the source of many beautiful stories; hundreds of volunteers from all over the world had participated. The aim of this projects is to protect the marine turtles working in tight collaboration with the local population who lives in Colola Town or as they say "the place where dreams come true" volunteers along with local people will realize activities to protect the turtles, and will help to ensure the survival of the turtles for the future generations. There are two species of turtles arriving to this area: Negra (Black Turtle) and Golfina (Olive Riddle Turtle), the size of the turtles vary from 1 meter to 1.5 meters long and the weight from 40 Kg to 100 Kg, Every turtle makes a nest of around 150 eggs. If you like nature, to spend a time in a astonishing beautiful virgin beach far away from hotels and tourists, and witness the magic that nature had made for millions of years this project is for you! If you want to see more information about the project visit the camp link at www.vivemexico.org/colola_turtles where you can see pictures, more information, comments of past volunteers, etc.

ACTIVITIES: The main work consists in patrolling the beach at night, find the adult turtles and collect the eggs, burying them in a secure place (vivero in Spanish) and set the baby turtles free back in to the ocean. This must be carried out by night since turtles do not go out the ocean by day (because of natural predators, it is safer for turtles to get out the ocean in the dark). In collaboration with local indigenous people from Colola, volunteers will seek for the turtles taking care of their eggs and the baby turtles. Locals are very friendly and working with them is very pleasant as they explain to the group what to do. We need very motivated volunteers who really want to get involved in this project willing to interact with the local people and their culture.

There are also some extra activities to do with the local people to help to improve the town like setting names to the streets or helping to arrange an all purpose play ground for the children and maybe some cleaning tasks, but it depends on your initiative!
